### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Contact with skin:

Immediately take off all contaminated clothing.

Areas of the body that have - or are only even suspected of having - come into contact with the product must be rinsed immediately with plenty of running water and possibly with soap.

Obtain medical attention if soreness or redness persists.

Contact with eyes:

Remove contact lens if easily possible.

Do not use eyewash or ointment of any kind (before obtaining an examination or advice from an eye

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specialist).

Wash immediately with water for at least 10 minutes, holding the eye open. Obtain medical attention.

### Swallowing:

Wash out mouth with water.

Do not under any circumstances induce vomiting. OBTAIN A MEDICAL EXAMINATION IMMEDIATELY.

#### Inhalation:

Ventilate the premises. The patient is to be removed immediately from the contaminated premises to rest in a well ventilated area. OBTAIN MEDICAL ATTENTION.

### 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

xylene

Penetration throught: inhalation, ingestion and in contact with skin. Oral LD50 (rat): 5 g/kg. Inhalation LC50 (rat): 6700 ppm/4 h.

n-butyl acetate

Low order of acute toxicity. Oral LD50 (rat): > 4.7 g/kg. Inhalation LC50 (rat): 9.6 - 29.2 mg/litre/4h. Dermal LD50 (rabbit): > 5 g/kg. No know reports of skin sensitisation.

butanone

Penetration throught: Inhalation, ingestion and in contact with skin. Oral DL50 (rat): > 2000 mg/kg. Inhalation LC50 (rat): > 5 mg/l. Dermal DL50 (rabbit): > 2000 mg/kg. High concentrations can cause depression of the central nervous system, with consequent headaches, giddiness and nausea.

Ethoxy propil acetate

Low order of acute toxicity. Oral LD50 (rat): 4755 mg/kg. Inhalation LC50 (rat): > 6.99 mg/l/4h. The degree of irritation was insufficient to warrant labelling as an eye irritant and a skin irritant.

## 12. ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION
